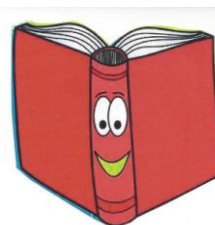

VEGETARIAN RECIPE RED POTATO SALAD WITH SOUR CREAM AND DILL

This recipe doesn't qualify as a "vegetarian meal," however, this is shared with you this month BY REQUEST (as a result of the recent progressive dinner).

2# small red potatoes, cubed

¾ cup mayo

¼ cup sour cream

chopped onion to taste (I like a lot!)

Salt & freshly ground black pepper to taste

1 TBS dried dill (more or less as you prefer)

1 TBS. tarragon vinegar

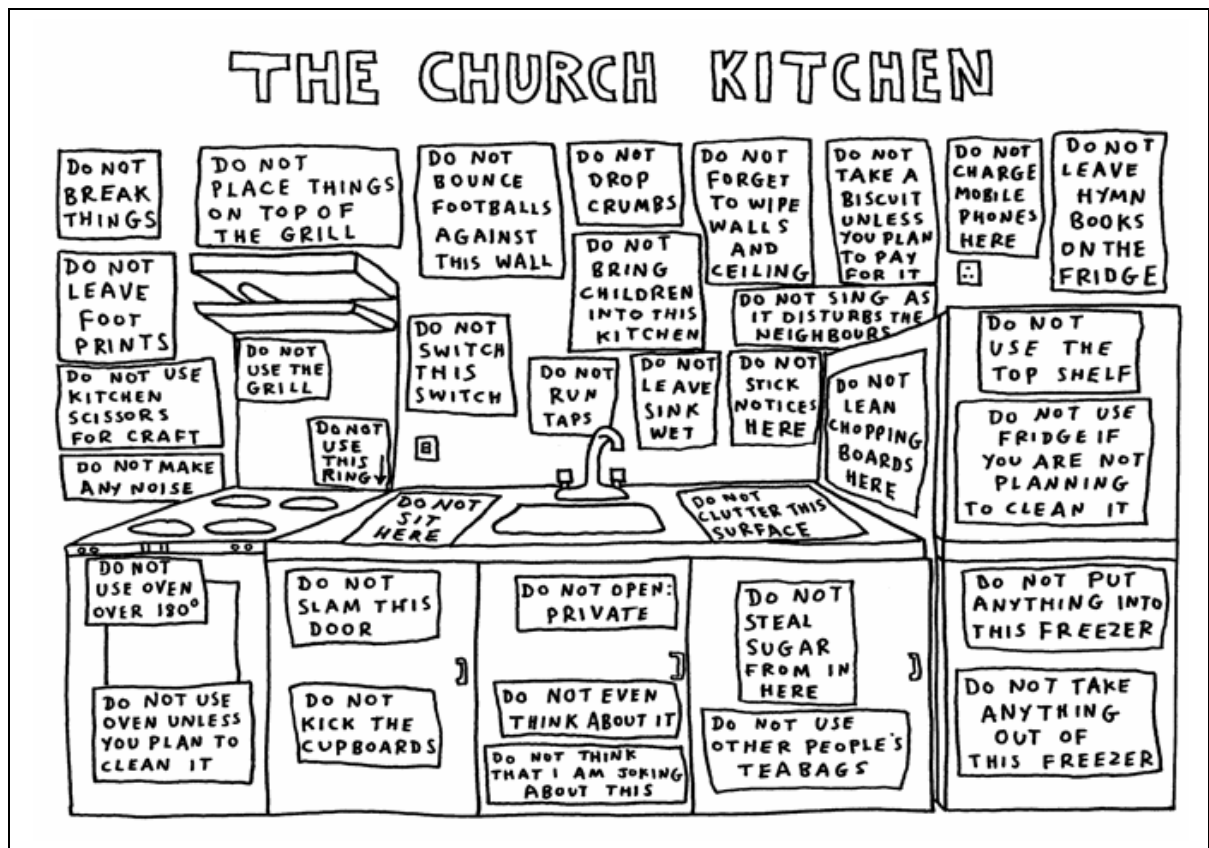
optional: 1 tsp. dill pickle juice

Cook potatoes until tender. Drain, rinse & cool. Mix the other ingredients together, then blend with potatoes. You can also add 1 cup diced celery, 2 TBS. diced dill pickle and/or 1 tsp. Dijon mustard You can play around with this one to your hearts content. And, I generally add more dill than recipe requires. **ENJOY** **CRC**

The past two months have been busy – the following projects were completed:

- ↑ Installed new locks on back double doors in Education Building
- ↑ Installed electrical service to the Hospitality Center in Linger Hall
- ↑ Repaired leak in circulatory pump head on boiler in Educ. Bldg.
- ↑ Replaced ceiling tiles in an office which were damaged by the leak
- ↑ Redirected roof water at corner of Educ. Bldg., added shrubs in corner along with river stone
- ↑ Cleaned beds, edged and trimmed on S. Florida and Latham Sts., also applied hardwood mulch (paid in full by a donation)
- ↑ Repaired handicapped parking lot light and the spotlight on Flame & Cross
- ↑ Repaired leak in hot water tank
- ↑ Installed a new fluorescent light unit in stairwell in Educ. Bldg.
- ↑ Installed electrical outlets in the Hospitality Center in Linger Hall

During his ministry John Wesley rode over 250,000 miles on horseback, and he preached over 40,000 sermons. For all the power of his eyes and voice, he measured five-feet-three inches tall and weighed 128 pounds. His brother Charles wrote over 6500 hymns. At John Wesley's death in 1791 his followers numbered 79,000 in England and 40,000 in America, But by 1957 there were 40 million Methodists world-wide.
