

TREE OF LIFE MINISTRY

The Micah team has decided to support a new project, the Tree of Life on the Rosebud Sioux Reservation in South Dakota. It is an advance special project of the United Methodist Church which operates in a similar manner to our own Parish House.

The Tree of Life supplies meals four days a week for people who live in one of the two United States counties which have the highest poverty rate and the highest need for nutrition assistance, according to the August 2014 issue of National Geographic. They are able to use our donations to purchase and prepare nutritious food for as many as 300 people for as little as \$75.00, or only 25 cents per meal.

Work teams from across the United States can donate time to repair homes and community buildings, assist with clothing distribution, economic development projects, etc., while learning how their culture and beliefs are similar to and different from ours.

The Micah team is pleased to add this worthy project to others which your donations support in our town, our state, our country, and our world.




