Martha Oldham: "Africa: Lord Hang Onto Me and Don't Let Go"

Martha Oldham was in her mid 50s when she went to Zaire, Africa, as a member of a Volunteer in Mission team (VIM). She went as a short term missionary to serve Rwandan refugees who were fleeing from the genocide to relative safety in Zaire. The Team was sponsored by the general Board of global Ministries of the United Methodist Church under UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief). When shooting broke out in the refugee camp the Team was quickly removed to safety. Martha, determined to continue serving in Africa as a missionary, subsequently served in Kenya, Ghana and Tanzania. These are her amazing and hair-raising stories.

#### **Trustee Report April 2018**

Lots of major work has been completed within the last couple of months.

- 1. The nursery is fresh and welcoming with new paint, ceiling tile, carpet, curtains and an area rug.
- 2. Another roof leak has been repaired.
- 3. Godwin Hall sports a new ceiling and LED lights.
- 4. The sanctuary light fixtures have been fitted with adapters allowing the installation of LED bulbs. The extra brightness is certainly noticeable immediately upon entering.
- 5. The Cub Scouts will occupy an additional room in the education building since the membership of girls will push their attendance to an all-time high.

The following projects are planned as money and time permit:

- 1. The front railing on the ramp leading to the education building will be replaced as well as the shrubs which are currently covering our sign.
- 2. The kitchen will see some new baseboard.
- 3. The choir room is scheduled for new ceiling tile and LED lights.
- 4. A railing will be installed along the walk from the parking lot leading to the elevator door, hopefully this fall.

The Memorial Committee, (Ellen Nickell, Mark Lynch and Karen Cartwright) who reports to Trustees, has ordered a new front door for the education building. The old ones are unable to be locked from the outside and the building is left open if someone goes out after the doors have been locked from the inside. Also there is much heat lost because of the spaces both above and below the current doors.

As always we Trustees are incredibly grateful to the church family for supporting the Endowment Fund which supplements our budget.

### Our United Methodist Roots - 50 Year Anniversary

#### The Methodist Church

John Wesley was a priest in the Church of England. After his spiritual awakening in 1738, he and his brother Charles created groups, called societies, of "Methodists" whose members followed a daily routine of spiritual disciplines and acts of service. As these societies gained popularity and spread, lay leaders began Methodist societies in America. In 1769, Wesley sent missionaries to America to serve these societies, but during the Revolutionary War, all but one of these preachers - Francis Asbury - returned to England.

By 1784, Wesley began ordaining lay preachers in America to spread the Methodist movement. In doing so, he realized that he was essentially creating a new church apart from the Church of England. In that same year, a conference of Methodist preachers was held at Lovely Lane Chapel in Baltimore, Maryland, on Christmas Eve. The name Methodist Episcopal Church in America was adopted for the new body, and Francis Asbury and Thomas Coke were elected superintendents (what would later be called bishops) of the newly formed church.

#### The Evangelical Church and the United Brethren in Christ Church

During the early years of The Methodist Church, two other churches made up almost entirely of German-speaking people were forming. The first was founded by Philip William Otterbein and Martin Boehm. Otterbein, a German Reformed minister, and Boehm, a Mennonite bishop, preached an evangelical message and experience similar to the Methodists. Their followers formally organized into the Church of the United Brethren in Christ in 1800. A second church, The Evangelical Association, was started by Jacob Albright, a Lutheran farmer from eastern Pennsylvania who had been converted and nurtured in a Methodist society. Albright and a group of his converts officially organized in 1803, creating the Evangelical Association. After a division and reunion in 1922, the Evangelical Association (later Church) merged with the United Brethren in Christ in 1946 to become the Evangelical United Brethren Church.

#### A Brief Timeline

- 1784 The first American Methodist Conference was held on Christmas Eve at Lovely Lane Chapel in Baltimore, Maryland. The name Methodist Episcopal Church was adopted, and Francis Asbury and Thomas Coke were elected superintendents (later bishops).
- **1800** United Brethren in Christ Church was founded with Otterbein and Boehm as bishops. This church became the first denomination to originate in America.
- 1830 The Methodist Protestant Church would be formed after splitting from the Methodist Episcopal Church over the role of laity in the church.
- 1844 The Methodist Episcopal Church South splits from The Methodist Episcopal Church over the issue of slavery.
- **1894** —The Evangelical Association splits into the conservative, mostly German speaking Evangelical Association in the Midwest and the more progressive, English-favoring United Evangelical Church in the East.
- 1922 The Evangelical Association and the United Evangelical Church reunite to become the Evangelical Church.
- 1939 The Methodist Church was formed when the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Methodist Episcopal Church South and the Methodist Protestant Church reunited to form a single denomination. As part of the union, churches were divided into administrative units called jurisdictions, five of which were based on geography. The Southern church agreed to union only after a compromise created a jurisdiction based exclusively on race, which was called the Central Jurisdiction.
- 1946 The Evangelical Church and the United Brethren merged to form the Evangelical United Brethren Church. The two denominations began merger discussions in 1926, but the United Brethren's long-standing ordination of women was a major obstacle. When the two finally joined, United Brethren women clergy who had been ordained for 60 years were forced to give up their clergy rights.
- 1968 On April 23, the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church united to become The
  United Methodist Church. With the merger, The United Methodist Church abolished a painful part of its history of
  segregation. The EUB, which was not segregated, made the dissolution of the Central Jurisdiction a condition
  for union.
