United Methodist Women

"The Power of Bold" was the theme for 2018 UMW Assembly held in May in Columbus, Ohio. The keynote speaker was Leymah Gbowee, a Liberian peace activist who led a nonviolent movement bringing women together to help end a civil war in Liberia in 2003. Sandra McCutcheon, Patty McComas, and Yvonne Foster shared some of the highlights of their experience at our unit meeting in September. In addition to worship and singing, sessions they attended tackled social and humanitarian issues such as the lack of clean drinking water in many parts of the world. Sandra learned how to make "plarn", plastic yarn made from plastic bags, and how to croquet it into useful items. The focus of the entire assembly was how women can be bold and work to promote needed social change.

In September UMW donated \$250 to Kairos Prison Ministry in addition to 115 dozen cookies, 4 cakes, and 2 pies baked by women of the church. This shows what we can accomplish when we come together for a common cause. We may never know the full impact of those cookies, but they make a bold statement showing prisoners that complete strangers do care about them and their relationship with God.

Our fall basement sale is October 2, from 8 am to 8 pm. This is an important fundraiser for UMW, as it provides money we use to support local organizations such as Crosslines, Women's Aid in Crisis, Habitat for Humanity, Upshur Helping Hands, COME, Kairos, and others. We need congregation and community members to donate gently used items, plus we really need volunteers to help sort, sell, and clean up. You don't need to be a UMW member. Last spring our local unit started the campaign "Be Just! Be Green!" to bring awareness to habits we can change that will help us be good stewards of our environment. "A Simple Response to the Opioid Epidemic" Sunday, October 28 2:00 pm Buckhannon-Upshur Middle School Library Presented by the Rev. Dr. Barry Steiner Ball Hosted and Sponsored by First United Methodist Church

Topics to be discussed: What are opioids? How are they different from other drugs? What happens in the brain that causes opioids to have such a hold on people's lives(physiology of opioid addiction)? Who are the groups of people who have been affected by the opioid epidemic? How can the church begin to respond to one of these groups of sufferers?

Barry Steiner Ball is a graduate of The Citadel, Duke University and Wesley Seminary. He is an ordained United Methodist Minister. In addition to serving churches, Barry has worked with the Maryland Natural Resources Police, as well as the Air Force Reserves as a chaplain. Most recently, he served on the NRP's Drug Enforcement Administration Task Force in Hagerstown, MD where he worked larger drug cases in Western Maryland and the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia. During this assignment he was exposed to the plight of Drug Endangered Children and began working with local United Methodist Churches helping them discover how they can support these children. Barry retired from the Maryland Natural Resources Police on Oct. 1, 2017 to work full time with local churches in helping them find their ministry in response to the opioid epidemic. His wife, Sandra, serves as Bishop of the West Virginia United Methodist Conference. They have two grown daughters, Sarah a high school math teacher in Talbot County Maryland and Becky, an aspiring princess at Walt Disney World.
