Youth Group News!



Commission on a Way Forward Laity Listening Event Saturday, Jan. 12, 3 pm to 5 pm Quiet Dell UMC

This listening event is offered for the Laity of the United Methodist Church to provide an overview of the petitions that will be presented at the special General Conference in February, 2019. There will be a summary of the process and of the three plans that will presented at General Conference, '19.

*VERY GENERALLY AND VERY BRIEFLY...

<u>The One Church Plan</u> that is generally endorsed by the Council of Bishops, the <u>Connectional Conference Plan</u>, and the <u>Traditionalist Plan</u>.

The One Church Plan moves toward unity and emphasizes our external mission by removing internal conflict. There is no change to structure of UMC and no division of the UMC and, removes language from the Discipline stating that "homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching.

The Connectional Conference Plan creates new structures to provide space between those who disagree about Christian ethics regarding marriage and suitability for ordained ministry. The Connectional Conferences would be separate legal entities but deemed part of one UMC.

The Traditionalist Plan retains, strengthens and enforces current prohibitions on same sex marriage and gay ordination and allows Annual Conferences to leave and create new denominations.

Again, these descriptions are very general and brief. The Listening Event will provide much more thorough information.

The following are the two closing paragraphs of a letter written by Bishop Sandra Steiner Ball.

"It is an anxious time – but we know for sure that we do not worship an anxious God. God's word is full of reminders that God is in control. We are not alone, God is with us. This is not our Church, It is God's Church and God will care for the Church.

Most importantly, no matter what happens in February we have work to do here and now. There are souls that need the saving power of Jesus Christ, there are people to feed, and there are lives to be touched and served by God's love in Jesus' name. In the midst of the other things that try to distract us from our mission and ministry, now is the time for us to once again align our hearts to God's heart, throw off fear and live in faithful trust that God will lead God's people to God preferred future."

What we all can do in the meantime...It is critical that as sisters and brothers in Christ we lift our West Virginia Conference delegates to General Conference 2019 up in prayer. Lacaria, Lauren Godwin, Mark Flynn) and 3 alternate lay delegates (Connor Kenaston, Royce Lyden, Fred Kellerman).



What is the LECTIONARY?

A sequence or list of lections (passages of scripture) to be read during the year. The Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) is a three-year cycle of suggested scripture readings that follows the Christian year. Each Sunday, four passages of scripture are recommended, usually two from the Old Testament and two from the New Testament. Thus, over a three-year period the Bible is covered in a systematic and balanced way.

January 27 Week: Nehemiah 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10; Psalm 19; 1 Corinthians 12:12-31a; Luke 4:14-21
