CHRISTMAS: canned corn, canned yams, canned green beans, applesauce or other fruit, cake mix, frosting, and canned pork'n'beans.



Only four chapters in the New Testament speak about the birth of Jesus, but this is the starting point for his imaginative journey into the lives of the people in the nativity story. Each year he tells the story through the eyes of different people – perhaps the Wise Men, or Joseph, or the Inn Keeper, or maybe a child, or modern-day grandparent. Maybe this book of stories will enable your imagination to write a Christmas story of your own!

UNITED METHODIST WOMEN

The United Methodist Women of First United Methodist Church feel very blessed to be able to make additional contributions to local service organizations in addition to budgeted amounts already awarded. We will be giving \$6000 to help with current needs in our community. Half of that comes from investments in the United Methodist Foundation that originated with the Helen Hall estate bequest to UMW in 2006. At that time, the UMW Executive Board, under the leadership of Ellen Nickell, President, recommended that the unit distribute \$60,000 for local needs, and invest \$40,000 for the future. The other half of this year's additional awards, \$3000, comes from member pledges and projects so far this year including our two basement sales and sale of bean soup kits. Our unit has continued the tradition of giving to local service organizations. The recipients include:


