Wednesday, September 6, was our first meeting of the fall. Sharla Smith, Director of Women's Programs at the Ruth House and Esther House, began our meeting. She explained more about the 180 Center, the main body that oversees the 2 women's residences and men's residences as well. They are recovery programs from addiction. We plan to support the women's programs financially, and with some needed supplies throughout the year. After our business meeting, we had a memorial service for Ellen Nickell. Ladies were able to share a special memory of Ellen.

October 3 is the Fall 2023 Basement Sale. Set up day is October 2, from 8 am -? Pack up is set for October 4. Items may be left in the former choir rehearsal room off Godwin Fellowship Hall during church office hours beginning Wednesday, September 13. All gently used items are welcome. There will be no unit meeting in October since we have the basement sale.

Unit monthly meetings for the fall/winter will be on the first Wednesday of the month. We also have 2 circles that meet most months, usually during the 3rd week.

United Women in Faith 2023 Social Action Priority: Climate Justice

This is a friendly reminder to do what you can to help look after Planet Earth.

- Reduce use of plastics, single use containers, and all Styrofoam products.
- Take reusable bags along when you shop, and if you forget, ask for paper bags.
- If you often drink water away from home, carry along a reusable container.
- Consider shopping at thrift stores that sell gently used items.
 This can save you money, plus eliminates many items from going into our landfills.
- Many items can be repurposed as they are or upcycled.
- Do several errands during the same trip to limit gasoline burned.
- Change your thermostat by a few degrees to save energy. Check into alternate energy sources.

FUMC has a drop off spot for plastic bags in the 1st floor hallway between buildings. In the back of Linger Hall there's a box for egg cartons, plus a container for bulletins and other "office type" paper. The main kitchen has bins for cans, plastic water bottles, and milk jugs.

FUMC Trustees are "getting things done" as the saying goes. The largest completed job was taking the old plaster down and replastering the Florida Street entrance to the sanctuary. The walls and stairwells look like new!

The double doors at the same entrance are due for new paint and red has been approved for that. It will be done soon.

The base coat has been applied to the parking lot fence which was built last year. A coat of stain is next – hopefully soon.

The tool shed is scheduled for a new roof.

Panhandle Cleaning and Restoration gave the parsonage basement a deep cleaning and treatment for mold.

With all of the rain, heat and Tom's (custodian) illness (COVID), the lawns and trimming demanded attention but he has everything under control now along with all the daily tasks. When you see him, say thanks!

The rusted railing to the right of the Education Building glass doors has been replaced and an additional rail will be added at the ramp leading from the sidewalk.

ST. JOSEPH'S HOSPITAL TO HOLD DRIVE-THROUGH FLU CLINIC ON OCT. 18th

BUCKHANNON, W.Va. –St. Joseph's Hospital will hold a drive-through flu clinic on October 18th, giving the community an easy way to receive the vaccine from the comfort of their own cars. The clinic will run from 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. Drive up to the hospital and follow the directional signage to register and receive your vaccination.

Two vaccines are offered this year. The quadrivalent vaccine guards against four strains of flu rather than the usual three and is available to those over the age of seven. These four-in-one vaccines will protect against two common Type A strains called H1N1 and H3N2, and the two distinct strains of Type B.

The FLUAD quadrivalent vaccine is available for those over the age of 65. This vaccine contains four times the amount of antigen as the standard vaccine and may be of benefit for older adults.

There are no out-of-pocket expenses for those with a valid Medicare card. Cost for all others is \$30 for the regular quadrivalent vaccine and \$90 for the high dose FLUAD vaccine. For those with Medicare, please be prepared to show your card when registering for the vaccine. For those paying for the vaccine, cash or check will be accepted.

People should begin getting vaccinated soon after the flu vaccine becomes available in order to ensure that as many people as possible are protected before flu season begins. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies to develop in the body and provide protection against influenza virus infection.

The vaccination is extremely important for young children, people 65 and older, pregnant women, people with existing medical conditions, and people who are in contact with those at greatest risk. Vaccinations will be available at the clinic for anyone over the age of 7; for vaccinations for children under the age of 7, parents should contact their family physician.
